

If Covid comes to the school...

We take our advice from the **MoE**. If and when a staff member or a student gets COVID we will contact you all immediately. The school may NOT close down. Potentially only the class the child/adult was in, will close.

Some proposals for teaching during Omricon. DRAFT ONLY

If the teacher is a close contact and does NOT have Covid, they will try and teach from home. The students will be in the class and the teacher is on the screen. Another adult will be in the classroom, if we can arrange to have one.

If the teacher has covid from outside of the school, we get a relief teacher.

We will follow the advice from the MoE/health as to what happens to the children in the teacher's class.

There is a shortage of relief teachers currently, so we will cross that bridge when we get to it.

If a large number of children are self-isolating at home, we will try and support them as best we can. E.G. They join the classroom online for particular sessions like, reading and maths etc.

We will send an email early next week and a paper copy, updating your computer requirements so the students are ready to learn from home.

Health Reminders

Please let us know if you or someone in your house is self-isolating due to a close contact situation.

Please keep your child home, if they have a runny nose, sneezing or other COVID/COLD like symptoms. If a child has to get tested for COVID, when in fact it was just a cold, then it affects the whole family, who have to self-isolate.
